FACTS IN BRIEF



- Purpose:** A comprehensive assessment of sensory-motor functioning
Range: 4–Adult (including geriatric population)
Time: 40–45 minutes
Scores: W, W Diff, impairment levels

The **Dean-Woodcock Neuropsychological Battery (DW)** is a comprehensive assessment of sensory-motor functioning that expands the psychologist's range of assessment and provides standardized procedures and normative information to typically unstandardized measures used in neuropsychology. The *DW* is comprised of three parts:

- Structured Interview
- Emotional Status Exam
- Sensory-Motor Battery

During the Structured Interview, clinicians assess and individual's personal history. The Emotional Status Exam focuses on psychiatric signs and symptoms – covering most major disorders found in the DSM-IV, as well as clinical impressions. The Sensory-Motor Battery consists of 18 subtests.

The *DW* offers different levels of interpretation that appeal to a wide range of professionals, from school psychologists with little or no background in neuropsychology to neuropsychologists and neurologists with extensive background in brain behaviour relationships. The *DW* may be used in either a fixed, flexible, or process approach to assessment and may be administered in schools, hospitals, mental health settings, or private practice.

The *DW* is portable and efficient – administration time is approximately 40 to 45 minutes. The *DW* provides:

- A summary of an individual's functional range of impairment – within normal limits or mildly, moderately, or severely impaired
- Measures of simple and complex sensory and motor functioning for more specific diagnostic capabilities
- Valuable measures of important sensory-motor functions frequently assessed in geriatric populations
- Measures of both cortical and subcortical functions for a more comprehensive assessment of neuropsychological fitness
- An interpretive connection with the *Woodcock-Johnson III Tests of Cognitive Abilities* and *Tests of Achievement*

The *DW Complete Kit* includes Carrying Case, Examiner's Manual; Stimulus Book; 25 Test Records; 25 Interview Forms; 25 Emotional Status Forms; and a plastic Storage Box containing: comb, scissors, key, candle, nail, paper clip, pen, ball, plastic fork, plastic spoon, stylus, eye occluder, and three blindfolds. A dynamometer is *not* included.

- Purpose:** A brief test of visual-motor integration
Range: 4–85+ years

Originally published in 1938 by Lauretta Bender, M.D., the **Bender Visual-Motor Gestalt Test, Second Edition (Bender-Gestalt II)** updates this classic assessment and continues its tradition as a brief test of visual-motor integration that may provide interpretive information about an individual's development and psychological functioning.

Uses

- A useful addition to a battery of tests in educational, psychological, and neuropsychological assessment; provides useful information for preschool screening as well as geriatric assessment
- Provides validity information for ADHD, mental retardation, gifted, learning disabilities, autism, and Alzheimer's Disease

Administration

The *Bender-Gestalt II* consists of a series of stimulus cards, each displaying a unique figure. The individual is asked to draw each figure as he or she observes it. The Stimulus card is not removed until the drawing is complete.

New Features

- Added items extend the range of ability assessed
- New recall procedures assess visual-motor memory provide a more comprehensive assessment of visual-motor skills
- Supplemental tests of simple motor and perceptual ability help identify specific visual-motor deficits
- Comprehensive testing observations include physical demeanor, drawing technique, and test-taking behaviour and attitude
- A timing component option measures drawing time for each figure
- Quick-and-easy comprehensive scoring criteria

Technical

The *Bender-Gestalt II* was normed on over 4,000 individuals ranging in age from 4 to 85+ years. The standardization sample is representative of the 2000 U.S. population. The *Bender-Gestalt II* was co-normed with the *Stanford-Binet Intelligence Scales, Fifth Edition*.
